



When you think of Brisbane, there's a good chance that you're picturing Ashgrove – hilly, leafy and charming with large wooden character homes designed to catch the breeze.

The Lifestyles of people in Ashgrove

There is a small strip of commercial development along its main thoroughfare, Waterworks Road. Here you'll find a number of shopping villages, tasty cafes and restaurants, as well as specialty stores to meet the needs of well-heeled locals. Ashgrove includes the neighbourhood of Ithaca, where there is a popular Institute of TAFE and the famous Broncos leagues club.

The Types of property in Ashgrove

Ashgrove is a traditional Queensland 'timber and tin' suburb, with generous Queenslanders, elevated post-war wooden homes and colonial cottages. Between the two World Wars, another style of housing became popular in this area: an elevated bungalow-style Queensland with several smaller gables and a large staircase leading up to the verandah – a style which became known as The Ashgrovian. A few boutique apartment blocks have popped up over the past few years – but the majority of Ashgrove locals tend to live in detached houses. Right from its establishment, Ashgrove has been a place for families. Today's Ashgrovian families may be a little more well-off, but they still enjoy this suburb's generous timber homes, leafy streets and friendly atmosphere.
